**IMPORTANT PULASKI COUNTY PREFERENTIAL PRIMARY
ELECTIONS INFORMATION
CHANGES TO EARLY VOTING AND POLLING LOCATIONS; NEW VIDEO PSA
ABOUT VOTING LAUNCHES**

(LITTLE ROCK, ARK.) – Pulaski County Circuit and County Clerk Terri Hollingsworth reminds voters the preferential primary election is set for May 24, 2022 for all registered voters in Pulaski County. The deadline for newly registered voters wanting to vote in the primary election was April 25.

Voters have the choice to vote by absentee ballot, early vote or cast their ballot on election day. Arkansas is one of [15 states](#) that conducts an “open primary” election allowing voters to select the Democratic, Republican or the nonpartisan judicial ballot regardless of their political affiliation. The Clerk encourages voters to download a copy of their sample ballot on the Secretary of State’s [VoterView](#) page and click the ballot link of their choice.

Today a new public service announcement video was launched on the Pulaski County Clerk’s website and social media platforms reminding residents about the upcoming election and the new voting laws.

“For the past three years, our office has been informing and educating residents about voting and found the use of social media has become more crucial. Voters want a quick way to catch up on the latest election updates and by offering video PSAs, we are able to give them the information they need right in the palm of their hands,” said Hollingsworth.

ABSENTEE VOTING

Pulaski County voters and/or their designated bearer have until May 20 before 5:00 p.m. to *request* an absentee ballot application. Due to new election laws regarding absentee voting, an absent ballot *returned* in person by the voter and/or designated bearer must be returned at the Pulaski County Courthouse the ***Friday before Election Day***, May 20 before 5:00 p.m. Absentee ballots that were mailed in must be *received* by the County Clerk's Office before 7:30 p.m. on Election Day.

Voters who wish to vote by absentee ballot can submit their request in person at the courthouse at 401 West Markham Street. Requests made by email, mail or fax must be received before 5:00 p.m. on May 17.

EARLY VOTING

There are 13 days of early voting beginning Monday, May 9 and ending Monday, May 23. There will be two early voting days on Saturday. The hours for early voting will vary with the main site, Pulaski County Regional Building open from 8:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. The 11 offsite early voting locations will be open at 10:00 a.m. and close at 6:00 p.m. All 12 early voting locations will be open on Saturdays from 10:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. The early voting site in Jacksonville has changed to Bethel Baptist Church.

The Pulaski County Regional Building will be the only early voting location open on the Monday before Election Day. It will be open from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m.

ELECTION DAY POLLING LOCATION CHANGES

Several changes have been made to polling locations. The election commission has selected 89 polling locations in Pulaski County; 54 locations in Little Rock, 15 locations in North Little Rock, five in Sherwood, three in Maumelle, and one each in Roland, Mabelvale and Scott. There are 18 polling location changes since the 2020 elections.
