"The Dragon Boat Festival is not just a fun and unique event; it's a vital opportunity to bring the community together and make a tangible difference in the lives of vulnerable children. It takes a team to paddle one of these amazing dragon boats, just like it takes a team of people to prevent child abuse in our community." Ms. Long went on to share, "Last year, this event raised almost \$200,000 and we MUST increase that so that no child has to wait for services to heal from the trauma of sexual abuse."

The festival encourages corporate donations, team pledges, and volunteer involvement, ensuring that everyone can play a part in this meaningful event. The event is free to spectators and guests.

Every effort and all support dedicated to this event goes directly back into the free services for CPC's two centers. The continued support from the community made the completion of CPC's home center expansion project possible, as well as the completion of phase 1 of the new north Pulaski County center (a \$1.5 million project), which opened on April 1, 2024.
